Easier than a traditional clamshell box, but just as elegant, this box consists of a single tray and a hard case which wraps all the way around the tray and closes using rare earth magnets and a sheet of tin.

TEACHING ARTIST BIOS

Erin Sweeney is an artist living and working in New Hampshire, having completed her MFA in Book Arts and Printmaking at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, where she was awarded the Elizabeth C. Roberts Prize for Graduate Book Arts. She holds a BFA in sculpture from the Maine College of Art in Portland, Maine.

Her current work combines fibers, text, and the book form. She is interested in all forms of building, be it conceptual or physical. Her current work revolves around the concepts and processes of building community, storytelling, and preservation. Making handmade objects, manipulating space, and utilizing printmaking processes in non-traditional ways are all a part of Sweeney's vocabulary.

She continues to show work nationally, most recently at Anderson Creative in Canton, Ohio, Bedford Gallery at the Lesher Center for the Arts in Walnut Creek, California, Creative Arts Workshop in New Haven, Connecticut, and Donna Seager Gallery in San Rafael, California.

Additionally, Sweeney is an instructor, teaching book arts workshops at her Lovely In The Home Press, in Peterborough, NH, and other locales. She is a member of the NH State Council on the Arts' Artist Roster, and is available for residencies and workshops.

Donna Globus earned a BS degree from Duke University, and a Master of Architecture degree from North Carolina State University College of Design. She completed a Master of Fine Arts degree in Book Arts/Printmaking from the University of the Arts in 2010. Donna balances her time as a book artist and printmaker with her career as a registered architect and construction professional. She is currently exhibiting work at the Hunterdon Art Museum and the Athenaeum of Philadelphia. Donna is a Continuing Education instructor at the University of the Arts, and a Board Member of Philadelphia Center for the Book.

Tara O'Brien is an accomplished book artist whose work is widely exhibited and collected. Her work is found in many collections, most notably, the Tate Modern Library, and the Art Institute of Chicago. Pieces range from contemporary structural explorations to traditional leather bound volumes. She is interested in conceptualizing the book and exploring its future. She uses unusual materials including ice, soap, grass, hair, shells, thread, and hand dyed papers as part of her language for expression. She believes that a narrative within a book can be something other than text and images. Tara received her MFA in Book Arts/Printmaking from The University of the Arts in Philadelphia, PA. Tara is currently the Director of Preservation and Conservation Services at the Historical Society of Pennsylvania and adjunct lecturer in book arts at Moore College of Art and Design.
